Dear Homeowner,

I hope this letter finds you well.

There has been a question raised around the volume of water in the aquifer to accommodate supplying the proposed Ballynahone Energy Storage project and at the same time not affecting local household water supplies.

In order to assess the hydrology resource and provide clarity on the above, the project consultant has arranged for a well drilling test rig to carry out an on-site survey. This will take place in May/June, when you may see a well drilling truck on-site for approximately a day, weather dependant, to complete the survey.

The results will be published in the Hydrology/Water Quality and Drainage chapter in the project planning application for consideration by Donegal County Council. This same information will also be available for you to view as part of the planning application. We will let you know when this application is being submitted.
